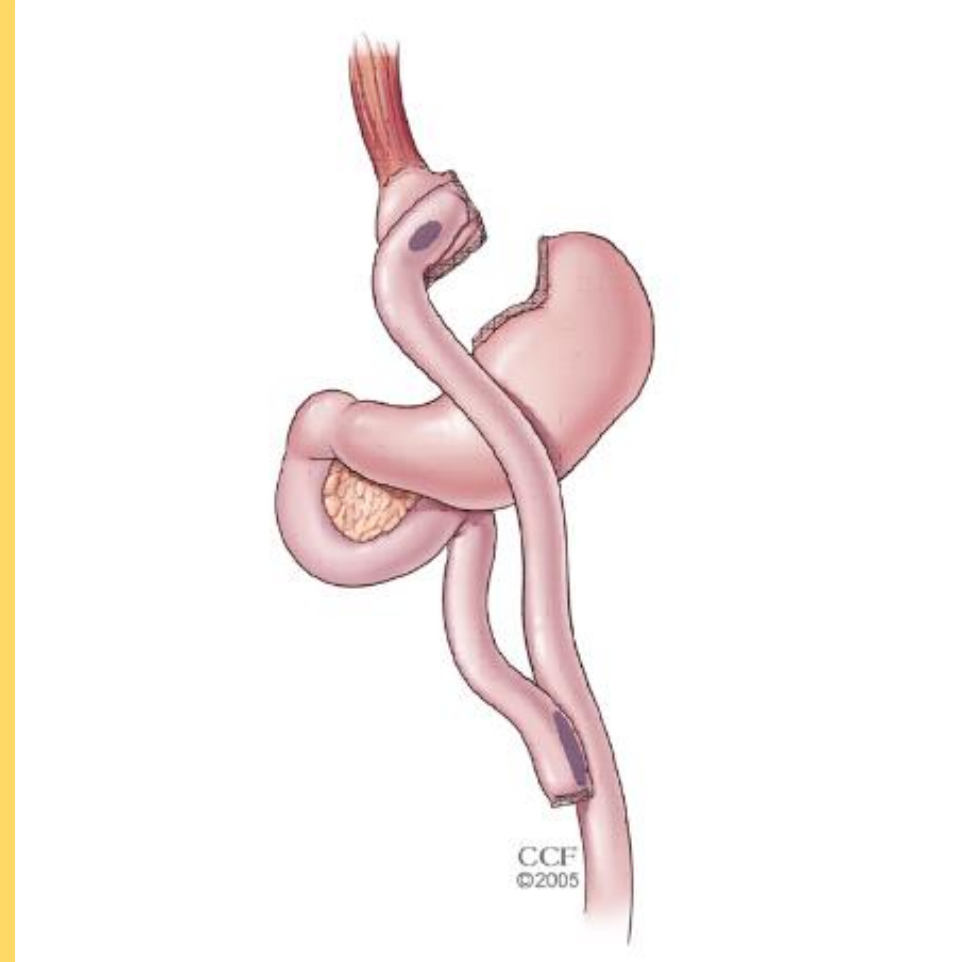
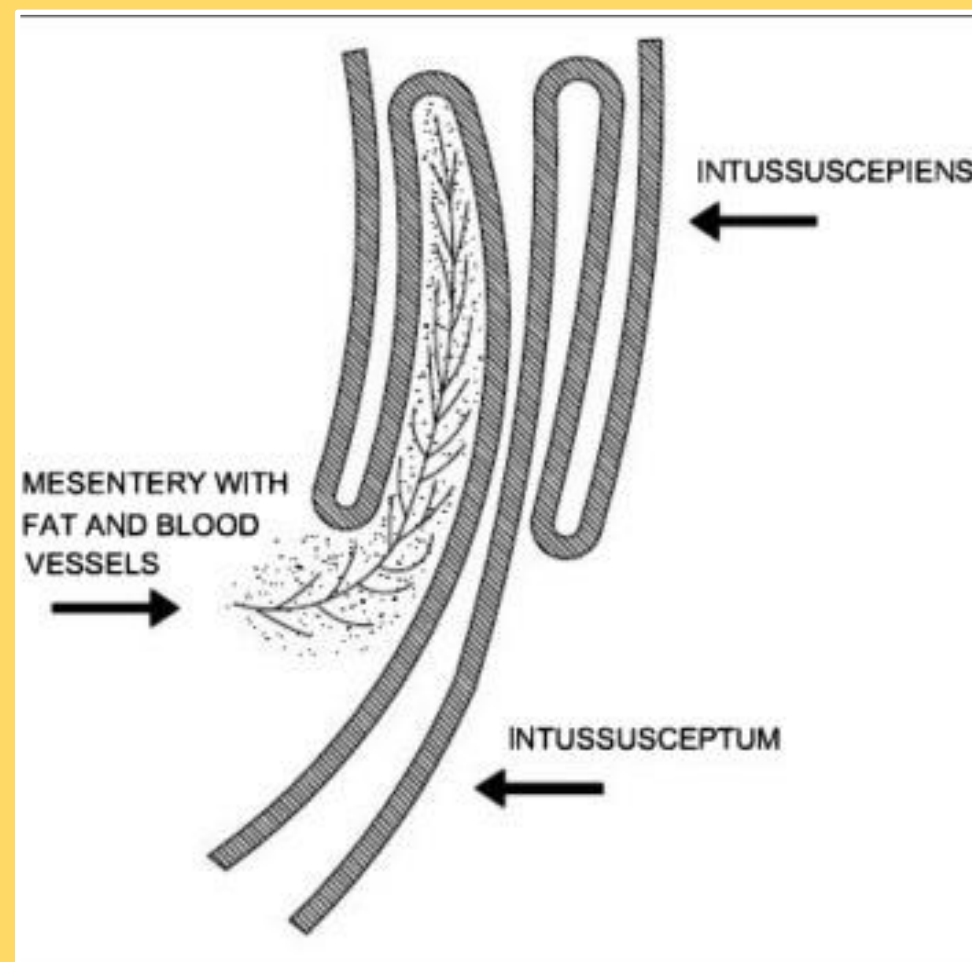


Sequential Common Channel and Roux Limb Intussusception After RYGB

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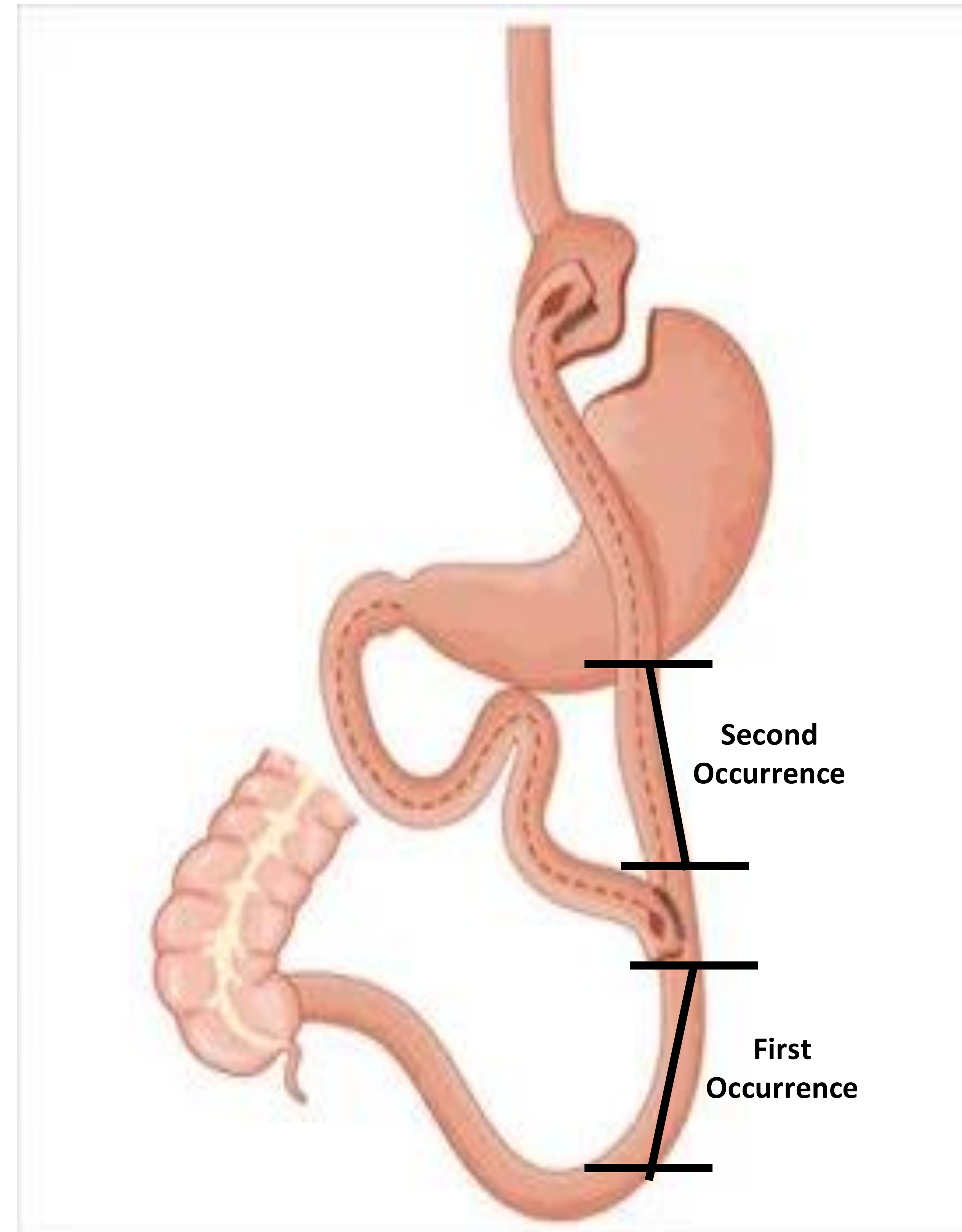
Intussusception after Roux-en-Y gastric is rare (0.1–0.3%)



Typically involves the jejunojejunal (JJ) anastomosis



Recurrent, multisegment involvement is exceedingly uncommon



Case Summary:

- 32-year-old female with prior RYGB presented with small bowel obstruction
- Initial surgery: common channel intussusception → JJ resection & reconstruction
- Recurrent SBO weeks later: Roux limb intussusception → repeat resection
- Uneventful recovery; symptom-free at follow-up

Conclusion:

- First reported case of sequential Common Channel and Roux limb intussusception
- High suspicion needed in RYGB patients with obstructive symptoms
